

10 Events to be Hosted Over Two Weeks at Library Branches Throughout the City

Hartford, Connecticut (March 10, 2014) – In celebration of National Poetry Month, Hartford Public Library will host a **multicultural celebration** throughout two weeks in April featuring performances and workshops by noted poets and the public. **From April 7 – April 16, special events will take place at the Library's nine branches, culminating with a Community Celebration at the Downtown Library on Saturday, April 19.** The citywide *Hartford Loves Poetry* festival is sponsored by the City of Hartford's Marketing, Events and Cultural Affairs Department, and is **curated by award-winning poet Bessy Reyna**.

"People have revered poetry throughout time and across the world, so the opportunity to create a poetry festival for Hartford sparked thoughts of the diversity and cultural richness of our many communities," said Reyna. "I imagined hearing poems read in a variety of languages by people who just love poetry."

**Each day of the festival, an esteemed Connecticut poet will read original works and present a workshop to inspire participants from each Hartford neighborhood to write their own poems and share them during an open microphone session. At the festival's grand finale, guests from throughout Greater Hartford will gather at the Library's Downtown location to share and enjoy works presented in the participants' native languages with English descriptions.** Attendees will enjoy poems read in more than 16 languages, including Tamil, Bosnian, Greek, Spanish, Polish, and Hebrew, celebrating the region's rich diversity.
