Hartford Youth Quilters' Exhibition Opening at Hartford Public Library!

"New Stories: Freedom Quilts Designed by Sankofa Textile Students" exhibit debuts at Hartford History Center at the Downtown Library on Saturday, June 29th

Hartford, Connecticut (June 25, 2013) — On Saturday, June 29th from 11:00 a.m. – 12:00 p.m., Hartford Public Library will host an opening reception for local Hartford students' exhibit, *New Stories: Freedom Quilts Designed by Sankofa Textile Students*. Reception will be held at Hartford Public Library's Hartford History Center (3rd Floor, Downtown Library, 500 Main Street). Light refreshments will be served. This event is free and open to the public.

The exhibit showcases quilts made by local youth in Sistah Nandi's *The Creative You* program at the Sankofa Kuumba Center in Hartford. The quilts were created by students of Ed Johnetta Miller, an internationally known quilter, artist, designer, teacher, curator and lecturer. Miller is acknowledged as one of the most creative and colorful improvisational quiltmakers in the United States. Widely exhibited throughout the country and internationally, her quilts can be found in many prominent museums, corporate and private collections including The National Gallery of the Smithsonian Institution in Washington, D.C.; Nelson Mandela's National Museum in Cape Town, South Africa; and the Wadsworth Atheneum Museum of Art in Hartford, Connecticut.
