

## 2012 One Book One Hartford Selects A Wreath For Emmett Till



Hartford, Connecticut (September 20, 2012) — Hartford Public Library is proud to announce that the poem *A Wreath for Emmett Till by Marilyn Nelson will be this year's*, **One Book One Hartford**, Hartford's citywide book club. The book, written by the former Connecticut Poet Laureate, is both an elegy to Emmett Till, the African-American teen from Chicago who was brutally killed at age 14 when visiting Southern relatives in 1955, and an invitation to heal.

# Show More Show Less

"I'm especially thrilled by the prospect of meeting and talking with a group of people who have read and possibly discussed my poem for Emmett Till. I know they will show me things I haven't seen, teach me things I don't yet know about the poem"-said Marilyn Nelson.

Marilyn Nelson, born in Cleveland, Ohio, is the author or translator of over twenty-four books. *The Fields of Praise: New and Selected Poems* (1997) won the 1998 Poets' Prize and was a finalist for the 1997 National Book Award, the PEN Winship Award, and the Lenore Marshall Prize. Her numerous young adult books include *Carver: A Life in Poems* (2001), which received the Flora Stieglitz Straus Award and the Boston Globe/Horn Book Award, was a National Book Award finalist and was designated both a Newbery Honor Book and a Coretta Scott King Honor Book. *A Wreath for Emmett Till*, also won the 2005 Boston Globe/Horn Book Award and was designated a 2006 Coretta Scott King Honor Book, a 2006 Michael L. Printz Honor Book, and a 2006 Lee Bennett Hopkins Poetry Award Honor Book.

"I'm happy about what **One Book One Hartford** has accomplished so far. Books capture history, and can introduce a world of ideas to the reader," said Mayor Pedro Segarra. "I look forward to joining the thousands of residents from across the City in reading A Wreath for Emmett Till, this fall."
